He pastored churches in Blaskovo, Dalgopol, Gradinarovo, Grozdovo, Komarovo, Kamen dyal, Markovo, Provadia, Sadovo, Snezhina, and Venelin. He could preach in Bulgarian and Turkish. He had the joy of the Lord because the Lord was with him. He was loved by all his churches. Like the apostle Paul, Demir thanked Christ Jesus his Lord, who enabled him, for that He counted him faithful, putting him into the ministry.

Through the years I have come to understand why the Lord's servants were sent out "two by two". Because the Bible says in *Ecclesiastes 4:9-12*, "Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labour. For if they fall, the one will lift up his fellow: but woe to him that is alone when he falleth; for he hath not another to help him up." Demir helped me, and I am thankful to God for my brother, my friend, and my fellow preacher.
